

Give a yell, give a cheer! Lady Lynx cheerleaders 'tumble' into Division 1 programs

wo Brandon Valley senior cheerleaders aren't ready to toss their pom-poms aside just yet.

Last week, Simone Kane and Julia Hemelstrand both signed letters of intent to be cheerleaders at Division I schools. Kane cemented her future at South Dakota State University, while Hemelstrand will cheer for the University of Minnesota Golden Gophers.

Katee Lane, who coached both girls in her final competitive cheer season, said both Lady Lynx are "well-rounded students."

"I know both of these amazing young women will do incredible things after high school," Lane said. "I am so proud of both Julia and Simone and wish them the best of luck in all they do."

Simone Kane

South Dakota State University For Simone Kane, the sport of cheerleading was a game-changer.

When she was younger, Kane said she had severe social anxiety, promptinh her mom to enroll her future college daughter in competitive cheer.

"It really helped to change who I was," she said.

Kane moved to Brandon Valley her sophomore year - the pandemic year - which made getting to know her classmates difficult.

But when she decided to return to cheerleading her senior year, Kane said that, too, was a game changer.

"I was finally part of the group

and I was welcomed. All of these girls and the coaches have been amazing to me, it's really meant a lot to me," she said.

It was also her senior season that inspired Kane to pursue the sport at South Dakota State University, where she will maior in psychology and minor in mental health services.

Kane blazed through tryouts - typically a four-step process - with flying colors. She was excused for half of the tryout process, which happened to coincide with prom.

Despite the "fast pass," Kane said she was shocked to learn that she was selected, noting she was post-surgery by just two months.

"I didn't think it was going too well for me, but I saw my number on there, and I couldn't actually believe that I was going to be a D-I athlete. It was like a fever dream that I didn't think would come true," she said.

Lane was elated to learn that Kane chose to join BV's competitive cheer team for her senior year.

"For that, I am thankful," Lane said of the Metro All-Conference selection. "Her drive, personality and commitment to her team and her own personal growth proved to be a perfect addition to the BV cheer team."

In her limited time at BVHS, Kane was also on the sidelines as a football cheerleader.

Her love for the sport comes down to "stunting and the relationships that you make," she said. "You get really close with those girls, so it builds life-long friendships."

She looks forward to the challenge of cheerleading at the collegiate level.

"I don't expect it to be that much more different, but I know the stunts are going to be a lot more difficult and the expectations are going to be a lot

higher, and I'm excited to really push myself," said the daughter of Lauren and John Kane.

By the next weekend, Hemelstrand found herself on campus trying out for the cheer team.

And two days later, she was notified that she made the team.

"It means a lot to me," Hemelstrand said moments following her signing ceremony last week. "I'm really excited to go to the University of Minnesota. I kind of decided later than most people did, but I went on a tour there and I really just fell in love with the campus."

Coach Lane said she had the

pleasure of sharing the cheer gym with Hemelstrand all four of her high school years.

"Her athletic ability, dedication and work ethic are unmatched," she said. "Julia's leadership skills and compassion are two additional qualities that will ensure her continued success at the collegiate level."

Cheerleading became a passion for the biology major. She said the sport offers a "family aspect."

"Your job is to cheer on the other sports and to cheer each other on, so you get both aspects," she said. "You get to be on the sidelines and be encouraging others but you also get to compete and work toward your own skills. There's a lot of work that goes into it."

Hemelstrand is already getting acquainted with her new teammates via practice sessions. She said the team has been "welcoming and fun."

Her long history in cheerleading began in middle school with All-Star Cheerleading. She stepped into the competitive program her freshman year, and by her sophomore year she was involved in competitive, football and basketball sideline cheer.

"It was a lot of cheering, a lot of different styles, a lot of different coaches and teammates,' says Hemelstrand, whose longterm goal is to go to dental school and pursue a career in orthodontics.

had similar goals when they began their senior powerlifting seasons. But while their goals were very much the same, Brandon Valley powerlifting coach Adam Bobzien said there are visible difference between the two 2023 state powerlifting champions.

"Isaac is definitely more of just straight power," Bobzien said of the 308-pound-plus competitor. "When you watch Isaac powerlift, he wows the entire crowd. He can shut-down the entire meet so that everybody watches the weight that he puts up and they're just amazed what he can do. That's just his style. It's just so much weight, so much power and people are amazed with that ability."

As for Olson, the 148-pound lifter heads the list of BV's "most decorated" weight class.

"We had our first state champion in that weight class many years ago in Riley Frantzen, and then Nick Hanson was amazing and kind of rewrote the record books after Riley had graduated. Then we had Carson Beyer last year who won every award possible

said. "We've had so many state champions and so many lifters that just standout in that weight class, and Kellen is absolutely just another one of those."

Kellen Olson

Olson got somewhat of a late start in the sport. He was a sophomore when some of his friends starting lifting together and he joined in. As a junior, his buddies encouraged him to get on the team.

"I've always wanted to be the big muscular kid and I always thought lifting heavy things was a cool thing," he says, "but I mostly did it for my confidence and to make myself feel better. It's addicting."

Olson achieved his goals by pushing himself "to the limit every single day."

"Every time you're in the gym, you just want to go as hard as you can, and that really excited me," he said.

Although he tips the scale at just 148 pounds, Olson's dedication to the sport is clearly visible in the numbers he's put up. He started out squatting 115 pounds, and this year raised that poundage to

state during their high school careers.

Olson's starting weight in the deadlift - his favorite of the three lifts - hit 185 pounds. He last lifted 465.

"It's a simple thing. Just pull it up. There's technique - you just got to pull it," he tells.


As for bench, he remembers hitting one plate – 135 pounds – four reps his first time in the gym. At this year's state meet, he benched 225.

After placing third at state his junior season, Olson set his sights on claiming the 148-pound title his senior year. He did just that by setting new records in squat,

"My friend last year broke all those state records and I told him I was going to come for him. We just joke around and stuff all the time, and he came and watched me do it. He was a little 'mad,' but it was all fun and games," Olson said. "When I first did it, it was like 'It's no big deal,' and then when I got home and I sat on my couch, I was like, 'Oh wow, I really did that.' I couldn't believe it. It took a few days for it to really sink in."

Bobzien points out that Olson lifted over seven times his body weight to earn state champion status.

"The thing about Kellen



where the next lift is going to take them, and Kellen was one of those people."

Olson plans to continue to lift, and will compete July 22 in Omaha at a USA Power Lifting event.

Isaac Johnson wished that he would've been introduced to powerlifting sooner than his sophomore year. And like Olson it was a trio of friends that lured him to the weight room.

Lilley & Misti Student-teacher relationship goes beyond the classroom

illey Lehfeldt and Misti Becker banter back and forth like an old married couple.

Lilley is a serious Raiders fan. As for Misti, well she loves the Minnesota Vikings.

And neither gives the other any grace when they're talking football.

But one thing the two can agree on is their relationship – now 14 years strong – has gone above and beyond student and teacher. "I'm your best harasser, right?"

Misti teases.

"I wouldn't say that," Lilley tosses right back.

Misti was first paired with Lilley when she was just 4 years old. But their relationship might never have been if Misti hadn't agreed to go back to school to get her Braille endorsement. The 20-year special education teacher first worked with Lilley on tactile things, such as how a cup or a toothbrush feels. As Misti learned the world of Braille, she also had to learn to teach it to Lilley.

"It took me out of my comfort zone," she admits. "It took me a few years to get through it, it was tough."

Misti said she considered throwing in the towel.

"Then I started working with her and I knew I couldn't give up," she said.

Instead of giving up, Misti followed the kindergarten curriculum in teaching Lilley the letters and their sounds and how they felt in Braille. Eventually, she taught her to read Braille.

"Braille was a little more complicated, because certain words mean the same as certain letters, but she caught onto that real quick. She can read Braille way better than I can," Misti said. "She's unique at doing Braille because she also has cerebral palsy, so she can't use her right hand, and a lot of Braille readers use two hands and she uses one Jill Meier, Brandon Valley Journal editor

finger while she's reading. The things that she has mastered has been amazing to watch her grow throughout the years."

With her assistance, Misti exposed Lilley to many things that she didn't necessarily want to try or want to do. In middle school, Lilley wanted nothing to do with having plaster put on her face to make a mask.

Misti delighted in the process, even joking with Lilley that she could go home and tell her parents, "You got 'plastered' in art!" Lilley, however, didn't find the humor in that.

said she's done her best to have Lilley in the classroom learning alongside her peers.

"I've challenged her to do the same thing that everybody did. We tried it first and if it didn't work, then I would modify it to her, but she's always been in the classroom with the kids basically doing all the same things," she said.

They went on class fieldtrips, finger-painted in Karo syrup, gone sledding, and had some fun in a bouncy house. Misti even brought

"She just whipped through Spanish I and Spanish II. We took biology and physical science and in high school we've taken every regular class that all the other kids were in," Misti tells. "I had to think outside the box every day, all day to come up with ideas to include her the best possible way keep her engaged because she wants to learn. To be able to explain it at her level and get her to kind of see it through her hands, I made a lot of creative tactile things and gone the round-about way of teaching her things."

"We've always said I was the Billy Madison, right?" she asks Lilley.

"Yep," she answers. Misti said that if Lilley studied, she knew the material.

"Thanks to me, you're a straight A student," Misti teases. "Good thing I'm smart!"

Unlike Lilley, Misty says she won't cascade across the stage on Sunday to receive a diploma.

That prompts a laugh from Lilley. Misti describes Lilley as a "major rules follower."

"I just keep trying to get her to break the rules," Misti teases, citing a planned field trip to a vocal rehab center as her "senior skip day."

"I don't ever want to skip school," Lilley corrects, which coaxes a chuckle out of Misti.

As their days together as student and teacher come to an end, Lilley says she's excited for graduation, but yet, a bit sad, too.

"I'm going to miss my friends," she says.

She's also going to miss her daily interaction with Misti, her teacher – and her friend.

Following graduation, Lilley will attend the Thrive program at Teachwell in Sioux Falls. Beyond assisting through the transition, Misti and Lilley's relationship changes from teacher and student to that of friends.

Since the two joined forces, Misti

her along to Yankton to watch her daughter, Brooke, play softball. When she entered high school, those experiences elevated.

"I'm sure I'll swing by her house," Misti assures.

it out that it's not like that," says the eight-time record holder. His resume of records include the South Dakota state record in squats in two weight classes, 300 and 308-plus, deadlift in two weight classes, most pounds lifted overall in two weight classes, and especially notable, the all-time state record since the 1990s in both squat and deadlift.

All this success for a guy who was trying to avoid competing.

"I wish I had started earlier. I feel like I kind of cheated myself out of more greatness. I just kind of did it. That's my thing. I try to go everywhere with a chip on my shoulder - like you're really good until you prove it otherwise. I feel like I said what I was going to do and then I just did it. That's the biggest thing and that's my goal in life is just to define what my goals are and then achieve them and then move onto the next one," he said.

Bobzien said that's the kind of student-athlete that Johnson has grown to be.

"He tried 600 pounds on the squat last year (at state) and didn't get the lights that he needed as far as passing the lift. This year, he came in with a goal - 'I'm getting over 600 pounds' and he achieved that goal. He fought through some injuries from football and from hockey, and that's the other

about Isaac is he has a full schedule of hockey that he deals with along with powerlifting. He's a busy guy and just very goal-oriented and very focused on what he does," the coach said.

Johnson's goal-focused concept helped him to elevate the weights he was lifting. As a sophomore, he squatted 495 pounds and benched 225.

"I want to say I failed a 500-pound (dead) lift. That was actually in the newspaper and my mom has that cut out on the fridge," he shares.

Johnson's record-setting performances at state this year came on a day when he wasn't 100 percent healthy.

"I was pretty sore and my hands were still ripped open from deadlifting the previous week," he said. "I wasn't really totally sure I could get that 605-pound squat up, but I did and it was just stellar. It was kind of a surreal experience, an out of body experience."

Johnson realized early on in training that he has the ability to succeed in the world of powerlifting.

"I kind of had inclinations because I was definitely surpassing my peers in the way that I worked out," he said. "Getting up at 5:30 in the morning, you're not always 100 percent there mentally, but you have to just do it. I just try to put my best foot forward every time - not just in powerlifting - but in everything I do.'
