# Loyalty to be on full display Sunday in Brandon

As the trees begin to bud and flowers begin to bloom, another spring ritual – Brandon's Loyalty Day Parade - steps off at 1 p.m. this Sunday for its 57th year.

Brandon's Loyalty Parade – deemed as the one of the largest Loyalty Day parades in the United States and one of the largest parades in South Dakota that traditionally has featured more than 200 units - draws thousands each year, as folks line the boulevards along Holly Boulevard and Main Avenue. The parade route begins at Brandon Valley High School, proceeds west on Holly Boulevard and then steers to the south at Main Avenue.

As always, there is no fee for parade entries and lineup begins at 11 a.m. in the high school parking lot on a first-come, firstserve basis.

What is Loyalty Day?

Loyalty Day is observed on May 1 in the United States, and is always recognized on



the first Sunday in May each year in Brandon. It is a day set aside for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States and for the recognition of the heritage of American

The holiday was first observed in 1921 during the First Red Scare. It was originally called "Americanization Day."

During the Second Red Scare, it was recognized by the United States Congress on April 27, 1955, and made an official reoccurring holiday on July 18, 1958. President Dwight D. Eisenhower proclaimed May 1, 1955 as the first observance of Loyalty Day. In 1958, Eisenhower urged Congress to move Child Health Day to the first Monday in October to avoid conflicting with Loyalty Day.

# Chuck Parsons parts ways with 24-year assignment as P&Z Commissioner

Be careful about the questions you ask and who you go to ask those questions.

That's hos Chuck Parsons' 24-year history as a Planning & Zoning Commissioner for the city of Brandon began in

"I approached Dennis Olson and asked him some questions about what P&Z did. I was curious about how – and not just Brandon churches and schools seem to be on main thoroughfares," he recalled.

At the time, Mike Schultz was the mayor, and Olson encouraged him to talk with Schultz.

And the rest is history. Twenty-four years of history.

Last week, Parsons made the motion to adjourn his final P&Z meeting in his Commissioner role. His first meeting was May 20, 1999,

and since that time, he's helped to shape this growing city into one of the state's largest cities.

"I felt good about it. It was fun, but it was also time that I didn't want to be one of those people that hung on forever," Parsons said.

One of the more notable changes Parsons saw happen in the P&Z world was how variances are han-dled.

"Back then, chairperson didn't vote and we had a city

council member on P&Z who voted," he said.

As only the recommending body to the city council for variances, it was in the early 2000s that the P&Z transitioned into the board of adjustment rather than the city council.

"Their meetings were taking a long time to deal with that. At some point, we, as a board didn't like that the council person got to vote

# Council upholds P&Z's decision to not allow firearms sales in residential setting

For the fourth time, Brandon resident Steve Reid was denied the opportunity to open an in-home FFL (Federal Firearms License) business out of his house at 1107 E. Lark St.

In September of last year, Brandon City Council voted 5-1 to uphold the Planning & Zoning Commission's decision to deny Reid of opening the home-based business. But Reid came back to P&Z last month asking the Commission for a conditional use permit to open a home-based business of applying cerakote or hydrographics, installation of accessories such as optics, grips, lights to firearms, and the selling of firearms and accessories.

The Commission denied those plans.

Reid filed another appeal to the City Council in hopes they would overturn the Commission's recommendation. That denial was heard Monday at City Council.

But in a unanimous decision, the City Council voted to uphold the Planning & Zoning Commission's recommendation to not allow the business to open.

Two residents in Reid's neighborhood also addressed the council.

"Planning & Zoning has recommended this to you," said resident Dan Mostek. "We hope you deny his request for the fourth time. Enough is enough."

The tone was less firearms concerns, and more about allowing retail into a residential

# Valley Springs Elementary to implement afternoon combined classes in 2023-24

Parents of third and fourth grade students entering Valley Springs Elementary School this fall received a letter last week from the Brandon Valley School District regarding changes for the 2023-24 school

The letter let parents know that the estimated enrollment for Valley Springs this fall would be 15-18 students in the third grade, and 7-9 in the fourth grade. Because of that low enrollment and section sizes throughout the district, the district is combining third and fourth grade classes in the afternoon only.

"Our educational staff is wellequipped and experienced in providing a dynamic and effective learning environment for students of different ability and age groups," the letter from district superintendent Dr. Jarod Larson said.

For fourth graders at Valley Springs, the school day beginning this fall will receive core content instruction such as English language arts, math, science and social studies from an instructor dedicated to fourth grade. The afternoon will be combined with third graders for encore subjects such as physical education, music, computers, library, counselor, STEM, Reading Buddies, peer mentorship and small Ggoup reading.

"By combining these grade levels for the afternoon, we believe

that we can efficiently provide a high-quality learning experience for each student," the letter read. "This will allow our teacher(s) to provide grade-level core content instruction in the morning. The afternoon will focus on encore subjects and provide engaging activities that promote student collaboration across grade levels and the leadership development of our fourth graders." It's a conundrum the district also

faced last year with the second and third grade classes. Initially, the district offered impacted families two options. The first was to keep their children in Valley Springs and have the students in a combined classroom. The second was to have their children bussed to Fred Assam Elementary – a 16-mile trek on the southwestern edge of Brandon.

Following a special PTA meeting called last year to discuss the situation – specifically the cost of bussing - District administration changed direction after several parents voiced their displeasure. In the end, last year's concession was that Valley Springs Elementary lost their reading interventionist four days per week. Fred Assam Elementary lost their reading interventionist one day per week, which meant that the third-grade teacher at Valley Springs stayed, thanks to the reorganization and the COVID funds provided by the federal government called ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency

Those ESSR Funds are no longer, and the decision to combine the classrooms in the afternoon is in effect for 2023-24.

As he noted last year, Larson said combining class grades is not an uncommon practice.

"Combination classrooms can currently be found across the state of South Dakota when circumstances warrant the systemic approach," he said. "Historically, Brandon Valley has previously utilized combination classrooms."

Also, impacted families have the choice to pursue in-district open enrollment to a different building within the district. Last week's letter read that the "administration will work to accommodate the re-

A question and answer session will be held for families beginning at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 3 in the Valley Springs Elementary lunchroom.

"I would anticipate questions about daily schedules, other support services, and in-district open enrollment, among other related topics," Larson said in an email to the Brandon Valley Journal.

Larson said during last year's negotiations with parents that the issue will only be resolved after the new Brandon eastside elementary opens scheduled for the fall of 2025. At that time, Valley Springs Elementary is scheduled to close.

twice, so we went to the council and said, 'We'll take all that on," he said.

Years ago, Parsons says variances were handed out like candy. Variances, sign ordinances,

businesses setting up shop in residential neighborhoods and apartments have long been tagged as "big ticket" items on P&Z agendas. Most, if not all, of their decisions were not just one-meeting and done.

"Like this Neighborhood Business District that we were asked to put together, I still think it should've been General Business. It's sitting on a truck route and is right across from an industrial park, so this is a good compromise. We worked on that for six months, and to sit there and try to compromise with the people that live in the neighborhood was a good exercise to go through," he said.

Emotions, he said, need to be thrown out of the decision-making process.

"That's one of the things I learned is you can't get caught up in emotion ... because if you do it for one, now you've got to do it for everybody," he said.

And typically, the opponent or proponent of any topic of contention, won't make someone happy.

"If we don't do one or the other, we probably didn't do our job," Parsons said.

With two Thursday meetings each month, Parsons invested many hours of his personal time into P&Z endeavors.

"I was blessed when I was working because the bank (First National Bank in Sioux Falls) encouraged me to be involved and allowed me time to do that. Our meeting were held twice a month. Sometimes we were done in five minutes and other times we would spend two, three hours. There were times I spent 10, 12 hours in a week researching topics or talking to staff about the loopholes,"

Parsons said there was only a handful of times there was a bank customer that had to deal with some-thing P&Z related.

"A lot of times I would check with the city attorney to make sure I didn't have a conflict. ... If I saw something coming up, I always told my customer that I wasn't going to vote for this, and everybody was pretty understanding," he said.

One frustration of serving in this capacity has been when the city council overturned a recommenda-tion by the P&Z or Park board, for example. "We would work on things

for several months and then pass it on to the city council, and then you have one or two people in the audience that show up and are very vocal about emotional things, and then the council will turn down what those boards recommended. That was very frustrating," he said. "The difficult thing to explain to people when you have a growing town is just because there was an empty field when you moved there, it may not always be an empty field."

Over the past few years, Parsons has begun his descent into retirement. He left his position as board member of the Brandon Valley Area Chamber of Commerce two years ago and will step down from the Brandon Development Foundation in the months to come. He's trading all of his civic duties in to enjoy life, but says he wouldn't trade these experiences for anything.

"If anybody wants to get in city government, you learn more as a whole on city council, and with Planning & Zoning you learn the nitty, gritty details of the ordinances and how they impact people and our businesses," he said.



# Second Judicial Circuit looks into digitizing over century worth of legal records; estimated cost exceeds \$2 million

SIOUX FALLS - At their April 25, meeting, Minnehaha County Commissioners heard a briefing from Judge Robin Houwman on local happenings and statistics within the court system.

Houwman discussed staffing and facilities in the Second Judicial Circuit, for which she is the presiding judge. According to figures she presented, there

are seven judicial circuits in South Dakota, and the Second Circuit, which is just Minnehaha and Lincoln counties, is by far the smallest, in terms of area.

However, due to the huge populations of these two counties, the Second Circuit has the largest caseload in the state.

In fact, Houwman said her circuit handled 34 percent of South Dakota's caseload in 2022. That left 66 percent of the cases for the remaining six districts.

The Second Circuit's 62,338 cases is followed by the Third Circuit's 26,812 cases. That circuit is made up of 14 counties, which include the larger municipalities of Brookings, Watertown, Huron, and surrounding areas.

To handle the larger load, Houwman added the Second Circuit currently has 12 circuit judges and four magistrate judges and is in the process of hiring a fifth magistrate judge, after the state legislature granted them the ability to do so during their last

In answer to a question from Commis-

sioner Dean Karsky, Houwman said that the state picks up some of the circuit's expenses, such as judges and staff salaries, but the county is on the hook for other costs, including facilities.

And some of those facilities involve the storage of records.

The Second Circuit Judicial Court Administrator Karl Thoennes told commissioners how state law requires the circuit to keep all records for at least 10 years, but that the major portion of

records have to be kept in perpetuity and have been since South Dakota became a state in 1889.

In 2012, the legislature defined that records can be kept digitally, and they have been since that time, but that still left 123 years of paper records needing to be stored.

Thoennes said that current paper records represent "about 10,000 cubic feet...that must be kept permanently."

To give commissioners a concept of size, he explained that a standard railroad car can hold around 5,000 cubic feet of material, and an 18-wheeler trailer hold approximately 3,000 cubic feet.

Thoennes then voiced the circuit's current dissatisfaction with the current records storage company.

He said that beginning around 2002, off-

site records were stored and archived by Records Keepers in a warehouse "just over the 10th Street bridge."

He added that Record Keepers did an "excellent job," and their rate of charging the county \$2,200 per month for storage and record retrieval remained stable for "at

least a decade."

But in March 2022, the business was purchased by Vital Record Control, a national record storage and archiving compa-

Thoennes plained that their monthly rates have more than doubled

since the acquisition a year ago. In addition, "without prior notice," VRC moved their storage facilities near the air-

"Since then, the court has had a great deal of difficulty retrieving records for court cases and the public," Thoennes wrote, "We sometimes wait weeks or months for

never received the missing records from Record Keepers." The county now budgets \$30,000 a year for record storage, but VRC has already increased that annual expenditure to over \$55,000, and Thoennes expects those in-

To deal with this, Thoennes said that the circuit is looking towards digitizing all of the old records to eliminate the need for dealing with companies like VRC to store its material.

The circuit has been working with Sioux Falls company Active Data Systems on a trial basis to scan 176 boxes from Lincoln County damaged, or in danger of being damaged, from flooding, as well as 20 standard storage boxes for Minnehaha County.

Just scanning Lincoln County's 176 boxes cost \$55,000, roughly one year's rent to

According to Thoennes, based on the scanning costs for Lincoln County, Minnehaha would be looking at a cost of \$312 per standard record box for its 6,600 boxes, or just over \$2 million.

But after this is completed, the state and Unified Judicial System would then assume all the costs of keeping the digitalized records, absolving the county of any further

No action was taken on this at the meeting, but Thoennes and Houwman did want to put the matter on the county's "radar" for future budgeting consideration.

The next county commission meeting begins at 9 a.m. Tuesday, May 16 on the third floor of the Minnehaha County Administration Building at Sixth and Minnesota in Sioux Falls.

# 'We'll be good to go'

# BVHS addition on pace to be ready for fall occupancy

It may still look like a major construction site, but work on the addition to Brandon Valley High School is right on schedule according to district superintendent Dr. Jarod Larson.

The entire project is on track to be completed before the start of the 2023-24 school year, and Larson said things will begin looking more complete as summer pro-

"It's shaping up to be a very important 10 weeks or so," he said. "We're going to basically be looking at the punch list items through the month of July and be set to open in the fall."

The overall project is broken into three areas: A, B and C. Larson said Area A - the furthest south area, closest to the library is nearly complete. As each area is completed, school officials and reps from Gil Haugan Construction will "punch" them out.

"There's a little bit of finish work to be done, but when that gets done we're going to close that out and we'll create a punch list for that and work it out," Larson said of Area A. "As soon as the respective areas get done, we're going to punch them out."

Larson said there are some renovations inside the high school

that are an aspect of the current project that will also be phased in after school dismisses for the year next month. Those, too, are scheduled to be completed by the start of school this fall.

It's not uncommon for landscape and/or aesthetic work to be addressed after a construction job is completed and a building is operational. However, Larson said on this particular construction project, he's hopeful everything will be completed before students return to the classroom this fall.

"With every construction project I've ever been involved with, we've dealt with punch list items, warranty items for a duration of time after the project was completed," he said. "But I think we'll be good to go to start for the fall of 2023."

Work began on the project in May of last year. Although an obvious headache for students and faculty for the 2022-23 school year, Larson said things have gone

"From an operational standpoint and an impact on this academic school year, it really has been minimal for the most part," he said. "I'd say it's gone about as smoothly as possible."

Larson said things will really start looking different along Splitrock Boulevard in July when Haugan Construction trailers start

moving out of the area.

"But you'll start to see some exterior things start to take shape with sidewalks, backfill, those types of things as we move through the month of May," he

Red highlights on the side of the building will also be added this summer that are sure to pop as commuters head down Splitrock. That material is on-site, Larson said, but obviously not (DD) placed yet on the new exterior.

Larson said the new interior finishes will also be branded in Brandon Valley colors and look. "We've got a long way to go,"

Larson said. "But we're sitting good in regards to timing. It's not different from any other construction project I've been a part of in terms of 'I wish they were ahead of schedule and under budget,' but at this point in time, the schedule has largely been complied with and is trending in the right direction and we're on budget."

The base cost of the 35,000 square foot addition is \$8.8 million. The project is being paid for entirely out of capital outlay cash placing no additional tax burden upon our constituents.

The Brandon Valley School Board approved the Haugan bid for the project last March.

# BVSD puts out early plug for 2023-23 bus pass purchases

Parents/guardians who want their child(ren) transported by bus to and from school next year need to purchase bus passes by the tentative July 28 deadline.

Those who fail to meet the deadline will need to find an alternative way through early October, as reported at the April 25 Brandon Valley Board of Education meeting. By the beginning of October, those riders will be integrated into the established bus routes/ centralized pick-up points.

The tentative timeline for bus pass purchases is July 5-28. Board member Gregg Ode reported

there are currently 24 morning and 24 afternoon routes, in addition to various Special Education routes that the district provides service for. Among the district's current fleet of vehicles are 37 buses, two mini-buses, 14 Suburbans, eight vans, four cars and nine pickup trucks. In this current school year, the District added a wheelchair van, a maintenance pickup and have two more propane-fueled school buses on order.

Ode said also under consideration is eliminating business for in-district open-enrolled students and updating the centralized pickup points for the current





Food, the Brandon Valley Scout troops made treks around local neighborhoods. The effort was led by Randy Gunnick and resulted in 473 pounds of donated goods.

A husband and wife – Henry and Margie Mueller of Tea-based Mueller Pallets – were recognized for giving in a big way to the BFP. Their connection to the Brandon Food Pantry came about by chance. As the story goes, Henry was watching a local TV news report that featured Weber. From that chance viewing, Henry immediately told his wife, Margie, that the BAFP would be their next non-profit to reap the benefits of their giving ways.

In November, they delivered pounds and pounds of donations to the BFP.

"Whatever she needed," Margie said.

As Weber soon learned, giving to others has been a way of life for the Mueller family. Henry, she explained, selects non-profits who could use a "hand up." They listed past donations to Honor Flight, Child's Voice and the Reservations in South Dakota.

"Our family has done a lot in all the communities in South Dakota, especially during COVID," Margie said. "We're doing a lot with food banks, a toy drive for the Indian Reservation and a teacher appreciation night at Catfish Bay. But we picked Brandon, because my sister-in-law lives here and we really like this community and really want to be a part of it, so we got together with Linda and are kind of fulfilling some of the needs."

Margie says she knows no different than to help where help is needed.

"I've always been this way," she said. "The food situation, we really saw when COVID hit. A lot of our employees lost their second jobs, so I first really focused on our employees, making sure that they have enough food at home for their children. Every two weeks, we do a food giveaway to them just like they would go to a food bank. They get the same items that Linda has here and they really, really like it. It's kind of a bonus to them."

Margie says their giving ways are made possible with a bit of giving from others, including businesses like Fareway.

"They give me a lot of deals for these food banks. Brian and Cullen from Fareway really help us out to put this thing together, and that's what we need to make it happen," she said.

Longtime BFP Board member Jana Lovrien, who passed away in 2022, was remembered by Weber and her volunteer staff. Her son, Adam and his family, wife, Bethany, and children, Charlotte and Calvin, and Lovrien's parents, Janice and Eddie, were presented a plaque in her memory.

and all that kind of stuff, I like that." he said.

And while he was drawn to music education, he knew early on that the high school level was his preference.

"In the state of South Dakota, in art, music and PE, you need to be certified to teach K-12, whether or not you want to, that's your choice, but your license is K-12. As a result of that in student teaching prep in schools for art, music and PE, you need to do student teaching in both elementary and sec-ondary. I knew I didn't really didn't want to do elementary when I got to it, and I knew I didn't want to do it when I got done. It just wasn't my thing," he

Gullickson's career started at the junior high level at Whittier in Sioux Falls. After three years, he de-cided to leave the teaching field.

"I just didn't think it was for me," he said. "I wasn't sure what I wanted to do, so I knocked around for a while.

But one of the things that I missed was being around teachers because it's a different en-vironment than any business environment. Teachers are just great people to be around. They're great people to have in your corner. We never quit teaching. We never quit that relationship thing with students or with colleagues, so that's one thing I missed."

He returned to teaching at a small town in West Central Minnesota for a yearlong assignment. Then he received a call from two friends about a late opening at Mitchell's junior high school. Gullickson said he interviewed on a Friday and the following Monday was at teacher in-service. That assignment lasted two years, after which he came to Brandon Valley.

Gullickson didn't come from a "musical family," although he said his father

"sang all the time." 'My dad would've been Bing Crosby. That would've been the style we heard most of the time," he said.

Gullickson has been a fixture in the orchestra pit for the spring musicals since the PAC's opening in 1999. He tosses out a quick trivia question: "Who was the first person to perform in there?" he asks and answers, "Nobody would think of this, but it was a student, Robin (Dump) Kruse (BVHS Class of 1999). We had an open house and wheeled in the piano that's in that room, which is hanging on by a

He's well enjoyed his view from center stage.

"I always say, it's been 24 years of the best seat in the house. In terms of what I thought my career would do – holy mackerel – I get to sit there, arm comes up, arm comes down and there goes the show. I have these amazing instrumentalists around me, these performers on stage in these crazy cos-tumes and sets, and everything. It's just all multi-media and I get to right in the center of it."

Gullickson said the PAC became a "game-changer" for the fine arts programs at BVHS.

"It's like field of dreams, if you build it, people will come," he says.

Prior to the PAC, choral concerts and school plays were performed in what is now the Auxiliary Gym or the North Gym, which is the currently wrestling/competi-

tive cheer gym. "The biggest change was the building of the Performing Arts Center for me professionally, for this program but also for the community," he confirms. "There's a B.C. and an A.D. and there's the Per-forming Arts Center what things were like before that and after that. It was just night and day and how people looked on things,

not just at the high school, but for K-12. It gets a little hectic at certain times of the year, but to have that facility, let's use it, let's not hog it for ourselves - it's districtwide – use it and get kids in there at a young age."

The past two years, Gullickson has served as the PAC coordinator. Taking over the reins from Kevin Brick, he says, was somewhat of a natural fit.

"Some of it is right up my alley and some of the technical stuff is over my head. ... The location of this room right across the hall just made it a natural fit for me. It's most used outside of our use is when our other buildings come over for programs. I just want to be a good host to make sure every-thing is set up and ready to go," he said.

Gullickson says he's leaving Brandon Valley out of frustration.

Instead, it's simply time.

"People older than me have said, 'You'll know when you're ready.""

"It's absolutely true. Things start to evolve and you know when it's time," says the 63-year-old. "This is an amazing job in an incredible school district, more than I could've dreamt up 30 years ago."

His plans in retirement remain unknown.

"We don't have any immediate plans. My wife (Lauri) also a teacher, has been retired for five years. She's ready for me to be home and to do stuff in a different facet of our life," he said. "That's the exciting part is to have no plan. I can eat lunch as long as I want to, whenever I want to, that kind of thing, and we'll figure things out."







Brandon Valley scored four times in the top of the eighth to defeat No. 4 Sioux Falls Jefferson 8-5 in extra innings Thursday afternoon at Sherman Park in Sioux

The win came in dramatic fashion with the score tied 1-1 after five innings. The Lynx scored once in the top of sixth and twice in the top of the seventh and looked to be in good shape for a 4-1 victory heading into the bottom of the final inning.

The Cavaliers answered, however, and scored three times in the bottom of the seventh to force extra in-

But as they've done before this year after giving up a big inning, the Lynx were unfazed and hung four on the board in the top of the eighth to secure the win and improve to 4-3 on the

Tenley Rude and Peyton Amdahl had 2 RBI each to lead the Brandon Valley offense. Left-hander Jorden Gabert pitched seven innings with six strikeouts. She started the eighth but gave up an RBI double, cutting the lead to 8-5. Macy Lembcke entered the game in relief and struck out the final two batters.

"The nice thing with Jorden and Macy is that we can piggyback off each other," Christensen said. "Throwing left and right-handed is always fun and always helps, just to try to give things different looks."

The win was Brandon Valley's fourth in five outings. Their one loss over that streak was a 4-3 setback to No. 1 Sioux Falls Lincoln on April 25 at Aspen Park. The Patriots are 6-1 on the season and widely considered the favorite to repeat as state champions.

Trailing the Patriots 4-0, the Lynx got two in the fifth and one in the sixth before falling just short of toppling

Although a seemingly solid outing for the Lynx, Christensen said the loss to Lincoln doesn't sit well.





# Dusty Zomer returns to 410 Sprint Car fulltime in '23

> familiar face and former champion will be back at Huset's Speedway this year.

Dusty Zomer, the 2015 410 Sprint Car champion, will be back fulltime with a new team owned by Jeremiah Jordahl. Jordahl is also a familiar name at Huset's, as the Madison native drove a Late Model Street Stock and 360 Sprint Car a decade

But Jordahl took a step back from racing 10 years ago to focus on his business, Advanced Contracting Solutions. That venture has clearly served him well as Jordahl and Zomer have gone all-in for the 2023 racing season and beyond.

The team has already competed this year in the High Limit Sprint Car series owned by Kyle Larson and Brad Sweet. Zomer finished sixth in the C Feature at Lakeside Speedway in Kansas City on April 11 and 19th in the B Feature at 34 Raceway in Burlington, Iowa, on April 25.

Those two early-season results obviously aren't where they want to be, but Zomer said they are working at building a high-power and well-financed team for the future. Part of the problem in building the program, Zomer said, has been getting equipment. When Jordahl and Zomer first began talking about forming the team in October of last year, they realized early on that the 2023 season would be run with used equipment.

"You've got my ears perked up," Zomer said when Jordahl first approached him late last year. "I told him I wanted to take it seriously and get the best equipment we can to put together a top caliber team."

Zomer said Jordahl agreed, but they were told it would take six months or longer to get new motors and frames. Those are currently on order and should arrive

sometime this summer, but in the meantime, they're using "seasoned" equipment that Jordahl was able to purchase from teams around the country.

"That's the biggest headache right now," Zomer said. "We knew it would be hard to put an operation together for 2023 if everyone's that far behind on stuff."

And it wasn't just frames and motors they needed to move forward last year. It's everything.

Jordahl sold all of his racing equipment 10 years ago, all the way down to his tools. But over the last several months, they've managed to put a car on the track with an arsenal of used motors and frames.

Zomer, a 2004 Brandon Valley High School graduate, said he's hoping that's just the start.

"We have four brand new Maxims (chassis) on order right now. When one shows up, we're going to order another one because we know it's taking that long to get them," he said. "That way you have a cycle going – same thing with motors. That's what the big guys do. They get into a cycle where they have 6-8 top motors that they can switch out. When one's getting refreshed, they're not hurting for motors."

They've given themselves a grace period to get things completely right. But they're also jumping into the deep end to get started. The High Limit Sprint Car series is the best-of-the-best with drivers such as Larson, Sweet, and all of the World of Outlaws (WoO) drivers competing.

"We like it because you're racing against

top-tier level teams," Zomer said. "I've raced against top-tier teams before. We're not picking the easiest schedule to go out and showcase a new team, but we want to attack it pretty hardcore and try to get to the top as fast as possible."

After a competitive 2017 season in the Buffalo Wild Wings No. 82, Zomer didn't race at all in 2018. He raced just 12 times in 2019 in a 360 Sprint Car. In late 2020, he partnered with Jud Krull in a 410 Sprint Car. He raced for Krull in 2021 and half

It looked like perhaps the 37-year old Zomer was slowly ending his racing career. He focused the majority of his time on his career at Zomer Trucking in Sioux Falls. But with the new partnership with Jordahl, he seems anything but a Sprint Car driver slowing down.

Zomer's last feature win in 410 Sprint Car was Sept. 15, 2017, an IRA Series win in Spencer, Iowa. He also won a WoO feature in 2015 at the World Finals in Charlotte becoming just the second driver from South Dakota to register a WoO victory. Doug Wolfgang of Sioux Falls is the other with 140 total wins.

"I truly feel that I'm in as good a shape as I ever have been," Zomer said. "I truly feel that I'm more than capable with my experience going out there and showcasing that I'm still able to do it at a high

As new equipment trickles in and with some track time already completed in 2023, Zomer said they're going to race for a 410 Sprint Car championship at Huset's this year.

"Hopefully by the end of the year we'll have brand new frames and we'll continue to cycle them out and just build the team to be bigger, better and stronger," he said. "That's the goal."

# BV boys claim team title at Pierre Legion Relays

It's only fair to give credit where credit is due, and for the Lynx boys track team, a large share of the credit goes to its field event athletes. That's where a bulk of the team points came from, as the Brandon Valley boys rose to the top of the 12team Pierre Legion Relays on April 25. The Lynx well out-paced runner-up Pierre, 155-124.33.

The Lady Lynx racked up 125 points, placing third behind Sturgis (134.5) and Pierre (134.1).

"Our field events are carrying us right now as far as our team points, because we have so many injuries on the running side," confirmed BV head coach Troy Sturgeon.

The BV boys placed 12 in the top eight of seven field events. Claiming first in the javelin was Brayden

Cline, who's throw sailed 162-feet-6. Wyatt Melcher also collected first place in the triple jump, which measured 43-2.5. Teammates Grayden Binger and Jesse Blok were fourth and eighth, respectively. Binger's jump measured 39-5 and Block went 38-0.25.

"Brayden consistently places in all three of his throwing events," Sturgeon said.

Cline also picked up

second place in the shot put (51-7) and third in the discus (143-9). Tristan Niewenhuis was second in the discus with his throw of 158-8. Senior Nate Van-DeBerg placed sixth behind his 129-2 discus throw.

"Nate has really come on in this year in the discus," Sturgeon said

that depth so we can put kids in our open events. That's where the challenge comes in for us (coaches)," Sturgeon said.

VanHemert and Hunt were also among the head of the packs in the 110- and 300-meter hurdles. VanHemert was tagged for second place in the 110s with his run of 15.62 and Hunt was third at 15.92. In the 200s, VanHemert registered a time of 31.05 for third place, and Hunt was seventh with a time of 43.52.

A trio of BV Lynx went three, four, five in the 800. Kern posted a time of 2:06.55 and was followed by Jackson Dathe (2:07.94) and Tyler Groen (2:08.81).

For a number of years, the Attorney General's Office has applied for and been awarded federal grant funds offered by the Office of Violence Against Women (OVW). The Attorney General's office has received the Improving Criminal Justice Response (ICJR) grant, which encourages state, local, to improve the criminal justice response to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking as serious violations of criminal law. and to seek safety and autonomy for victims, by requiring the coordinated involvement of the entire criminal justice system. The foundation of the program is a Coordinated Community Response (CCR), which will bring together a diverse group of community partners to work together to address the widespread impact of domestic violence or Intimate Partner Violence (IPV). As a subrecipient, Minnehaha County would not only serve on the statewide team, but would also advance local efforts by working with our community partners to enhance services for victims and hold offenders accountable. The proposed amount of grant funds that Minnehaha County would receive over the course of thirty-six months is \$706,577.30. The proposed funds would be used to fund an existing .5 FTE Detective with the Minnehaha County Sheriff's Office dedicated to Intimate Partner Violence (IPV), a new full-time 1.0 FTE Deputy State's Attorney dedicated to enhancing strategies for effective prosecution; and a new part-time .5 FTE Investigator in the State's Attorney's Office to assist with follow up investigations and prosecution. In August of 2021, Minnehaha County Commissioners adopted Ordinance MC 21-59 establishing the requirements, fees, and regulations for the issuance of alcoholic beverage licenses within Minnehaha County. In addition to the ordinance, the Minnehaha County Commissioners adopted the number of allowable on sale and off-sale liquor licenses at 13. The 2020 census figures also support 13 on-sale liquor licenses and offsale liquor licenses. When issuing an on-sale liquor license, Minnehaha County currently charges a fee consistent with the fee charged to the nearest municipality for on-sale liquor licenses. With the exception of Sioux Falls and Brandon, the fee for a new on-sale liquor license and renewal fee is \$1,200. The fee for a new off-sale license is set at \$1,200 and a renewal fee is set at \$500. The fees for the temporary licenses were reviewed and increased in 2022 with no proposed changes for the upcoming year as those fees are spelled out in state statute. In addition to the special event fees, there is a publishing fee for each application. After reviewing the costs associated with publishing the special event notices, the Auditor's Office is recommending an increase in the publishing fee from \$50.00 to \$55.00. Blomgren was born and raised in nearby Beaver Creek, Minn. Following high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Army serving in 1/164 Armor Battalion in Fort Steward, Ga. He attended the U.S.M.A. Preparatory School in Fort Monmouth, N.J., where he received his appointment to West Point. Shortly after his dad had a major heart issue, Blomgren chose to leave active duty and return to Minnesota to go to college.

At the University of St. Thomas, he majored in finance and gained his commission as an Armor Officer through ROTC in May of 2003 and was assigned the G Troop 113th Brigade Reconnaissance Troop. Blomgren met his wife Heather in June of 2003. They were engaged a year later and were married in May of 2005. Two months

later he was deployed with B. Company 2-136 Mechanized Infantry in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom as a Platoon Leader.

During their time in combat, his unit served in the Al Anbar Province of Iraq in support of 2nd Marine Expeditionary forces and Col. G.H. Bristol. Bravo Company suffered three soldiers killed in action and multiple other wounded due to IED attacks and sniper engage-

Following their return home in July of 2007, the Blomgrens began their family. They are parents to three sons, Jack, 14, Grant, 12 and Bryan, 9, who named after one of the soldiers his platoon lost in combat, Sgt. Bryan Thomas Mc-Donough.

His last assignment as a Captain during his military service was as a Senior TAC Officer at Camp Ripley, Minn., where he helped train future leaders, many of which led soldiers in combat after gaining their commission.

# All about the significance of the Poppy

During World War I, after a particularly bloody battle in the fields of Flanders in Belgium, thousands of bright red flowers mysteriously appeared. Poet John McCrae, a lieutenant colonel in the Canadian Expeditionary Forces who had just lost a friend to the war, was so moved by this spontaneous bloom that he wrote a poem about their resilience entitled, "In Flanders Fields."

The 1915 poem was instantly popular, spurring the Royal British Legion – a UK charity organization which to this day supports veterans and their families - to sell 9 million handmade poppies on Nov. 11. Thus began the "poppy emblem"

and the first Poppy Appeal, which is a fundraising event to raise money for war vets held each November in honor of Remembrance Day.

On April 29, Poppy Prince Jett Koll and Poppy Princess Olivia Jackson were assisted by Post member Earl Meyer at Sunshine Foods in Brandon, where they sold poppies. Donations for the poppies go directly to the Veteran Relief Fund and is used specifically for veterans in financial need.

Brandon's Loyalty Day Parade now 57 years strong – wouldn't be possible without the efforts of its volunteers and community support.

# Friday morning breakfasts satisfy bellies and brings community together for conversation

all it the best kept secret, as it's been taking place for the last five to six years. And it came about in an unexpected way.

It takes place on Friday mornings, and for those on a tight budget, this is the place to get your moneys' worth.

For five bucks, diners can enjoy a morning feast of eggs, meat and more at the Valley Springs American Legion. The donations, says Commander Rick Larsen, cover the breakfast supply costs and anything extra goes to the Legion coffers for the community service they provide.

"We used to go to the Pit Stop and would meet there on certain days because they made French toast," said Legion member and French toast "chef" extraordinaire Kenny Bodewitz.

But when the Pit Stop closed its doors, that left Bodewitz and his breakfast buddies without a place to enjoy the morning meal and conversation. The void was filled when the Legionnaires opened the Hall.

"It started out with somebody went to Brandon to get a box of donuts," Bodewitz recalled.

Then, somebody brought an egg bake one day.

And that's how the Friday morning breakfasts at the Legion Hall became a weekly staple.

At first, the Friday morning breakfasts drew only men to the table. Bodewitz said the women soon joined them.

But their place was at the table, not in the kitchen, as that's staffed solely by the men.

"See how it works," said Ardell

omelets to order and biscuits and gravy." On this particular Friday, Bodewitz was manning the electric griddle filled with slices of bread dunked in an egg and milk mixture.

"Some people don't like cinnamon," Bodewitz explained, as he sprinkled the seasoning over each piece of bread, "so we make some plain, too."

"When we have the Baseball Breakfast, that's what I do is make French toast," he said. "Then I have two grills going. I've been doing it long enough so I have it down to a science."

Larsen, a retired firefighter, is in charge of the eggs. He stood before an electric fry pan on this particular Friday gently stirring the liquid gold-colored egg mixture into scrambled egg form.

"It's just as much socializing as it is eating," he tells.

The Friday morning breakfasts draw about 20 people each week, including Keith Staeffler.

"I like talking to everybody and getting a weeks' worth of gossip. It's a reason to get together," he said. Larsen said the weekly gather-

ings also serve as a way to check in on one another "to make sure we're doing OK." "Everybody checks to see what

each other's problems are," adds Bodewitz. Topics of conversation are your

typical topics: health, neighbors, the weather and whatever the news of the day is.

Larsen and Bodewitz said they landed the "chef" roles by default.

"We didn't duck quick enough," Larson jokes. "When you're with the fire department, if you didn't cook, you didn't eat."

His long-time prowess in the fire hall kitchen also gained him the knowledge of how to make biscuits and gravy.

With a line of tables set for the Friday morning diners, bowls of steaming hot eggs and smokies, and plates of aluminum foil-covered French toast are brought to the table for family-style serving.

"Notice how quiet it gets when we're all eating," said diner Dean Henricks. "That's when we do what we do best."
